The Australian Seafood Industry Council (ASIC) is the peak national body representing all sectors of the seafood industry including wild harvest, aquaculture and post-harvest activity.

Sudden Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) has had a devastating impact on the Australian seafood export market. Five of the six major export markets (Hong Kong, China, Taiwan, Singapore, Japan) are located in North Asia, and have drastically contracted since late March. This is attributed to sharp reductions in consumer demand due to the outbreak of SARS in those countries with a resulting downturn in restaurant and supermarket trade.
